

This Half Term's School Priorities Update:

RAP 1: Developing mastery and reasoning in Maths

This half term, interviews with the pupils showed that the use of reasoning activities in Maths is well embedded across the school. The children spoke articulately about their learning, and how feedback that teachers gave them helped them to move forward. Staff have also received further training on Maths Mastery from the Maths Lead.

RAP 2: Close the gap between vulnerable learners and their peers

Staff have been assessing pupils this week and altering intervention plans ready for the new term. Children accessing Nurture are progressing well with their targets and all pupils in Years 3 and 4 have had sessions. Taking Care Project and Anti-bullying weeks have been a success.

RAP 3: Raising Achievement in Reading

Pupil's reading ages have been reassessed and the Reading Lead is analysing the impact of this intervention. All staff have received Local Authority Phonic Training. Year 3 parents come and read to the children once a week—this has been enjoyed by all. If you are a parent of a child in Year 3 and are interested in coming along, please contact Mrs Marsay via the school office.

RAP 4: Measuring the Impact of Intervention Strategies and Evaluating Effectively
