

This Half Term's School Priorities Update:

RAP 1: Developing mastery and reasoning in Maths

This half term, concrete resources have continued to be sourced for classes to support pupils learning. Shared resources have been re-allocated and re-positioned within school for increased access by pupils.

RAP 2: Close the gap between vulnerable learners and their peers

School leaders have successfully completed the final assessment for the Achievement for All Quality Mark, which was passed with flying colours. The use of Dojo has continued to support home-school communication for all pupils.

RAP 3: Raising Achievement in Reading

The Lead Teacher for Reading has provided staff training for teachers on how to analyse accelerated reading data. This has provided clarity on strengths and weaknesses, both within classes and for individual pupils.

RAP 4: Measuring the Impact of Intervention Strategies and Evaluating Effectively

The Performance and Standards Committee has received a report from the Strategic Lead for Lower Achieving Pupils. They have been informed on the processes undertaken by school and given the opportunity to challenge performance of interventions.

Checking your child's eyesight

Children may not always know that they have a vision problem. It is therefore recommended that children have regular eye tests. These should be carried out **at least** once every two years, even if there are no problems with their eyesight. These tests can be done at a high street opticians and are free for all children under 16 years old (and those under 19 years old in full-time education). You can speak to your child's Optician if you have any concerns about their vision.
