

This Half Term's School Priorities Update:

RAP 1: Developing mastery and reasoning in Maths

Year 4 teachers will be completing their training later this term, ready to deliver Maths Mastery to the new year 4 from September. Across the school, children have been consolidating their Maths knowledge from the year and applying it to solve higher level problems, explaining their reasoning.

RAP 2: Close the gap between vulnerable learners and their peers

Pupil Progress Meetings have shown that staff continue to be held to account over the progress of vulnerable learners. As such, clear plans are in place to get the most out of the children for the remainder of the year. Support from Teaching Assistants is to be re-organised from September in order to maximise progress for vulnerable learners through targeted interventions.

RAP 3: Raising Achievement in Reading

Summer term assessments for the Accelerated Reading programme have been completed with all classes, showing good progress overall across all year groups. A range of new books have been purchased to support the next academic year. The children have really enjoyed the quizzes and using the library.

RAP 4: Measuring the Impact of Intervention Strategies and Evaluating Effectively

Senior Leaders are currently in the process of reviewing interventions; some have worked better than others. This knowledge has been used to purchase new programmes, which includes training staff to use Thrive (an exciting programme to support social and emotional wellbeing).


