## This Half Term's School Priorities Update:

## RAP 1: Developing mastery and reasoning in Maths

Year 4 teachers have completed their training ready to teach Maths Mastery from September. Across the school, children have continued to apply their Maths knowledge to a range of problem solving activities.

## RAP 2: Close the gap between vulnerable learners and their peers

Plans are in place to run a number of new intervention programmes across the school from September, targeting our vulnerable learners. These include Thrive (Developing resilient and confident children), B Squared (Maths) and additional reading support.

## RAP 3: Raising Achievement in Reading

Following the success of the Accelerated Reader programme this year, we will continue to develop practise across the school to ensure that all children make at least good progress. This year, vulnerable learners have made an average of just under 11 months progress as a result of the strategies in place.

## RAP 4: Measuring the Impact of Intervention Strategies and Evaluating Effectively

Senior Leaders have acted upon reviews of interventions from last half term, and researched programmes that will best meet our needs. We look forward to seeing the impact next term.
