This Half Terms School Priorities Update.

RAP 1: Raising Achievement in Reading

We are ensuring that every class has a class reader and that all pupils have reading books for home and school. Please support us in listening to your child read at home and adding to their 100 Hours Reading Award which the children are doing really well with. Please can we ask you to check that your children are using Bug Club at home. Thank you.

RAP 2: Sufficiently Accelerated Progress for Disadvantaged Pupils

We have introduced our new Attendance Tree and the children from each class come down to take the attendance for their week. The children than pop this on to the classroom door – we feel that it is already helping raise awareness of the importance of attendance.

RAP 3: Ensuring Good Outcomes through Robust Tracking Systems

Targets have been set for Pupil Consultation Evening and the children have also shared what they are most proud of this term. Pupils in Years 5 and 6 have now started to write in black ink so that their Purple Polishing Pen responses can be clearly seen.

RAP 4: Developing Mastery and Reasoning in Maths

We are working on concrete learning in maths as well as increased opportunity for pupils to respond to challenging questions. Much of our maths will be mastering skills applied through puzzle and problem based activities.

Altogether BLJS have raised a massive £104.49 for Macmillan.

£14.87 of this was raised by Destiny (4Tomlinson) Lily (5Horowitz) and Cain (6Lewis) who did a cake sale at home, and bought the money they raised into school to be added to our overall donation to Macmillan.

It makes us so happy when we hear of the amazing things some of our pupils do at home for charities!



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
