Dear Parents and Carers,

One of our parents suggested that we have a Children's Self Evaluation of the school (known as a Children's SEF). The House of Lords have written an action plan from their SEF and are working on these actions this year—please see the Parliament section below for an update.

In a bid to get children thinking about healthy hearts and bodies, Mrs Marsay has introduced lunchtime Marathon this half term. In the summer term the Marathon will be an additional part of our lunchtime activities and the children who choose to take part will receive incentives and be given goals. We are really pleased to have had an external advisor in to school this half term to look at the quality of our Theme books. The advisor gave direct feedback to the staff stating that they had 'not seen such high quality topic books in a long while' and that the books showed a great range of cross curricular input (maths/ art/ geographical mapping,) as well as high quality sustained writing. I am sure that you will join me in sharing our pride in what our children and staff achieve.

On a sporting note we have competed with success in swimming, indoor athletics and rowing. This included us representing East Warwickshire Rowing where both the girls' and boys' teams came 4th (the boys missed 3rd place by 2m!)

Please have a great Easter break—hopefully snow free—and we look forward to seeing you all in the next term.

This Half Terms School Priorities Update.

RAP 1: Raising Achievement in Reading

This half term the children enjoyed celebrating World Book day. The costumes were really varied and creative, allowing the children to really get in to the spirit of reading. As part of this day the children reorganised and replenished their reading areas—which continue to look inspiring. Our governor Karen Miles has been in to talk to Miss Coulson about English and the reading books look of high standard across school.

RAP 2: Sufficiently Accelerated Progress for Disadvantaged Pupils

Year Heads and SLT have challenged staff on their interventions for pupils through Pupil Progress meetings, paying particular regard for those not those not on track to meet expectations. All pupils are progressing well from their starting points. Achievement for All leads have received a successful external review of pupil progress and actions. Forest School training is set to be completed for 2 members of staff in the first week after Easter and the landscapers have been in and agreed plans for the Forest School area.

RAP 3: Ensuring Good Outcomes through Robust Tracking Systems

Staff are now a term in to using O Tracks' Class Track which enables teachers to fine tune pupil progress and achievement. SLT have begun to look at the Flight Path data in order to monitor progress for pupils from starting points against age related and termly targets. We feel that we can now clearly show progress in a variety of ways.

RAP 4: Developing Mastery and Reasoning in Maths

Mrs Beck our maths lead has successfully completed consortia maths moderation and all teaching staff have taken part in a consortia maths moderation activity. Our books and judgements faired well against other schools, a judgement which was supported by our governor Karen Miles on her monitoring visit. We








We are really happy with how much people have been using their Mathletics accounts both in school and at home.



So far 5Horowitz has been holding this position.





A Message from the House of Lords.

As part of the SEF we also wished to make some changes to the current school dinner menu. To begin this process we have planned to meet with the school dinner ladies next half term.

A Message from the House of Commons.

Everyday at 3:00 the moving library is brought around to different classrooms and gives students the opportunity to take out a book for a week. We are hoping that this encourages more students to read and choose some of the schools great books that may not otherwise be read.
