This Half Term's School Priorities Update.

RAP 1: Raising Achievement in Reading

Our efforts to promote vocabulary through reading and to deliver reading lessons with high challenge have been recognised by Ofsted. Staff have been acknowledged as selecting quality texts which engage readers. The children talked with great excitement about their books and different authors. We have secured Accelerated Reading for September 2018 and in the light of Ofsted feedback are also looking at further phonic resources to run alongside this.

RAP 2: Sufficiently Accelerated Progress for Disadvantaged Pupils

Our Ofsted inspector noted that books for our disadvantaged pupils are in line with their peers and although we have a gap between the cohort and our disadvantaged pupils, we are working hard as a school to deliver some nice initiatives. Some of our staff have received Forest School training which will benefit all pupils in September, but with a greater focus on disadvantaged groups.

RAP 3: Ensuring Good Outcomes through Robust Tracking Systems

Assessment systems in school enabled us to confidently share data for our Inspection. We can see that the pupils are moving along well from their starting points.

RAP 4: Developing Mastery and Reasoning in Maths

Mrs Beck and Mrs Duynstee have been to London to receive leader training on Maths Mastery which will role out to Year 3 from September. Staff for Year 3 will be receiving training later in the term. The programme looks exciting and works in partnership with White Rose (our current initiative) so there are many skills that we can thread in to the other year groups.






